A New Beginning for A New Year

As we enter this New Year, many of us are thinking and making resolutions about those things we know we have to do, like losing weight,

exercising, eating healthier, and taking our vitamins. We also begin to list out what we need to do spiritually, like reading the Bible and praying every day, using our gifts and talents in God's service, to be more loving, Christ-like, and obedient to God's word.

The only problem is that while we resolve to do these things, our resolve soon fades because we really don't have the power to keep them. And it doesn't have to do with our will power, but rather because circumstances beyond our control happened which puts all our plans on the back burner, if not in the trash.

And so, as we enter into 2023, what we need is a new beginning, which starts with a new heart and new spirit. This promise is given to us by the Lord through the prophet Ezekiel. "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them." (Ezekiel 36: 26-27 NKJV)

What the Lord is talking about is giving us a heart transplant, but not a physical transplant, but rather a spiritual one. The heart is more than a bodily organ that pumps life-giving blood to the rest of the body. The heart is symbolic of all that it means to be human.

There are over 5,000 heart transplants done every year, and we are the first generation to understand how a new heart can replace an old one. Having witnessed the actual, physical transplant of a human heart, we are the first generation who can get the feel of the kind of heart transplant God desires to do, and we can understand the notion of how a new heart might change us radically and alter us forever.

Having such a new heart will give us a strange and wondrous feeling that somebody else is inside us, and how grateful we are to the one who has given it to us so that we may live. As believers we can also be grateful, because beating inside of us is God's own heart.

Often times when we think of the heart, we think of it in terms of love, romance, and compassion. And while this may be, in the Bible the heart is the seat of wisdom; it's where all of our decisions are made. Solomon said that as a person thinks in their heart, that is who they really are (Proverbs 23:7a).

But that isn't really a good thing, because it's from our hearts that most of our problems develop. The prophet Jeremiah makes this observation. "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked." (Jeremiah 17:9 NKJV)

Jesus talks about how important the condition of our hearts is. He said, "The good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and the evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart. For out of the overflow of his heart his mouth speaks." (Luke 6:45 NIV)

And while this is the main reason why we need a new heart, we also need a new heart because our hearts have become hardened by life's trials.


Today, especially during this holiday season, and with the pandemic in full swing, our hearts have become hardened. But God can give us a heart transplant, where He'll remove our stony heart and give us a heart of flesh, that is, a heart that is open to all God has.

Therefore, let's ask God to do some cardiovascular surgery to get our hearts pumping once again with that life giving and life saving blood of Jesus Christ.

But beyond a new heart, God also wants to put a new spirit inside of us.



Traditions

Family traditions are strong bonding times. Certain activities, certain places, certain togetherness repeated periodically make for strong family bonding. Christmas and birthday celebrations done a certain way, family dinners with certain customs, and the repetition of family outings. These all bring strong solidarity to family life. It is important to create traditions of spiritual significance as well. These times help us remember all that God has done for us so that we can continue to be faithful to him in the future.

Traditions are important (see Ex. 12:14). God endorses traditions, especially those that have spiritual significance. Traditions promote togetherness and help us remember all that God has done for us. The greatest inheritance you can provide for succeeding generations is a tradition that reminds them frequently of God's blessings and warnings (see Joel 1:3)

When wonderful things happen, pass them on to your children and grandchildren. God had sone wonderful things for the Jewish people through Esther, things so wonderful that they must not be forgotten for generations to come. Make it an annual tradition to share past blessings (see Esther 9:28).

There are dangers to look for regarding traditions. Worldly traditions may look charming or interesting but be careful. In accepting the traditions, you may also be accepting ungodly thoughts and practices (see Deut. 18:9 and 2 Kings 17:33).

Religious leaders complained that Jesus' disciples were not keeping one of their traditions. They were so locked in to the tradition that they had lost the spiritual meaning, and therefore criticized Jesus and his followers. When we allow our traditions to take our focus off Christ, we may be in danger of staying away from him (see Matt. 15:2).

Don't allow traditions to take your focus off Christ (see Rom. 4:11-12) NLT

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 1 can (14.5 oz) Wegmans Petite Diced Tomatoes
- 1 can (28 oz) Wegmans Crushed Tomatoes
- 4 cloves garlic, peeled, minced
- 1 white onion, peeled, 1/4-inch dice (about 2 cups)
- 1 green bell pepper, cored, seeded, 1/4inch dice (about 1 cup)
- 1 jalapeno, cored, seeded, 1/4-inch dice (wear gloves when handling)
- 1 lb Wegmans 80/20 Ground Beef
- 1 can (15.5 oz) Cannellini Beans, rinsed, drained
- 2 cups Wegmans Organic Beef Bone Broth
- 1 container (2.08 oz) Wegmans Organic Chili Seasoning
- 1 Tbsp hot chili powder
- 1 Tbsp Wegmans Organic Ground Cumin
- 1 1/2 tsp salt

Directions

1. Add tomatoes, garlic, onion, peppers, jalapenos, ground beef, beans, broth,

- chili powders, cumin, and salt to slow-cooker. Stir to combine; cover.
- 2. Cook on HIGH 4 hours or LOW 8 hours.

Homestyle Meatloaf



Ingredients

- 1 pkg (1 lb) Wegmans 80/20 Ground Beef
- 2 Wegmans Organic Large Brown Eggs, beaten
- 1/2 cup Diced Onions
- 2 Tbsp Wegmans Basting Oil
- 4 1/2 Tbsp Wegmans Memphis Style BBQ Sauce, divided
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 1 1/4 cups Wegmans White Panko Bread Crumbs

Directions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Add beef, eggs, onion, basting oil, 2 1/2 Tbsp BBQ sauce, salt, pepper, and bread crumbs to large bowl. Mix with hands to combine. Form into loaf shape; center on baking sheet.
- Bake 30 min. Remove from oven; top with remaining 2 Tbsp BBQ sauce. Return to oven; bake, 25-30 min, or until internal temp reaches 160 degrees (check by inserting thermometer halfway into loaf).
- Optional: Serve with warmed "Mother Sauce". (Optional sauce is not included in dietary keys or nutritional info.)

4. Chef tips: *Any barbecue sauce or ketchup can be used. *Meatloaf freezes beautifully. Slice it first and take it along for work lunches. Some people will tell you they make meatloaf just for the leftovers! Warmed with gravy or cold with ketchup, everyone has a favorite.

Roasted Yukon Gold Potatoes with Garlic & Rosemary



Ingredients

- 1 lb Wegmans Yukon Gold/Butter Potatoes, scrubbed, unpeeled, large dice (about 4 potatoes)
- 3/4 cup Wegmans Organic Extra Virgin Olive
 Oil
- 2 cloves Wegmans Peeled Garlic, minced (about 1 Tbsp)
- 1 Tbsp chopped Wegmans Organic Rosemary leaves
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp fresh ground pepper

Directions

- Preheat oven to 500 degrees. Add potatoes, olive oil, garlic, rosemary, salt and pepper to 9x13-inch pan. Stir to combine. Arrange potatoes in single layer.
- Roast in oven 20 min. Transfer potatoes to plate with slotted spoon. Carefully drain excess oil from roasting pan. Return potatoes to pan; roast about 5 min, until crispy on bottom and edges.
